Under the *Port Authorities Act 1999* (the **Act**), KPA has a duty to act on commercial principles and perform defined functions, including the protection of the port environment and minimisation of the impact of port activities on that environment


To achieve KPA's environmental commitment, KPA will:

- comply fully with all laws, regulations and standards with respect to the environment, apply responsible standards where legislation and regulations do not exist and require similar performance by all parties active on KPA lands and the wharf;
- integrate environmental management requirements into our business objectives and provide adequate resources to support our environmental strategies;
- continually improve our environmental performance and minimise environmental impacts across our operations, both land and marine side;
- ensure that our employees, contractors and port users are aware of their responsibilities relating to the environment and comply with KPA's procedures where applicable;
- provide appropriate information and training to KPA employees and contractors;
- work with KPA tenants to identify and manage environmental aspects associated with their operation;
- consider the impact our operation has on our environmental footprint, including the environmental impacts of procured goods and services;
- implement appropriate environmental monitoring programs to assist in minimising environmental impact from Port activities;
- incorporate pollution prevention practices into our operating procedures and processes;
- respect ecological, heritage and biodiversity values;
- report openly and accurately on our environmental performance;
- have a current Environmental Management Plan that outlines the strategic direction for the port and the key focus areas; and
- continue to implement, review and maintain the KPA Environmental Management System (EMS) in line with AS/NZS ISO 14001 2016.

This policy will be reviewed every two years to ensure that it continues to accurately reflect the scope of our activities and our environmental standards and objectives.
